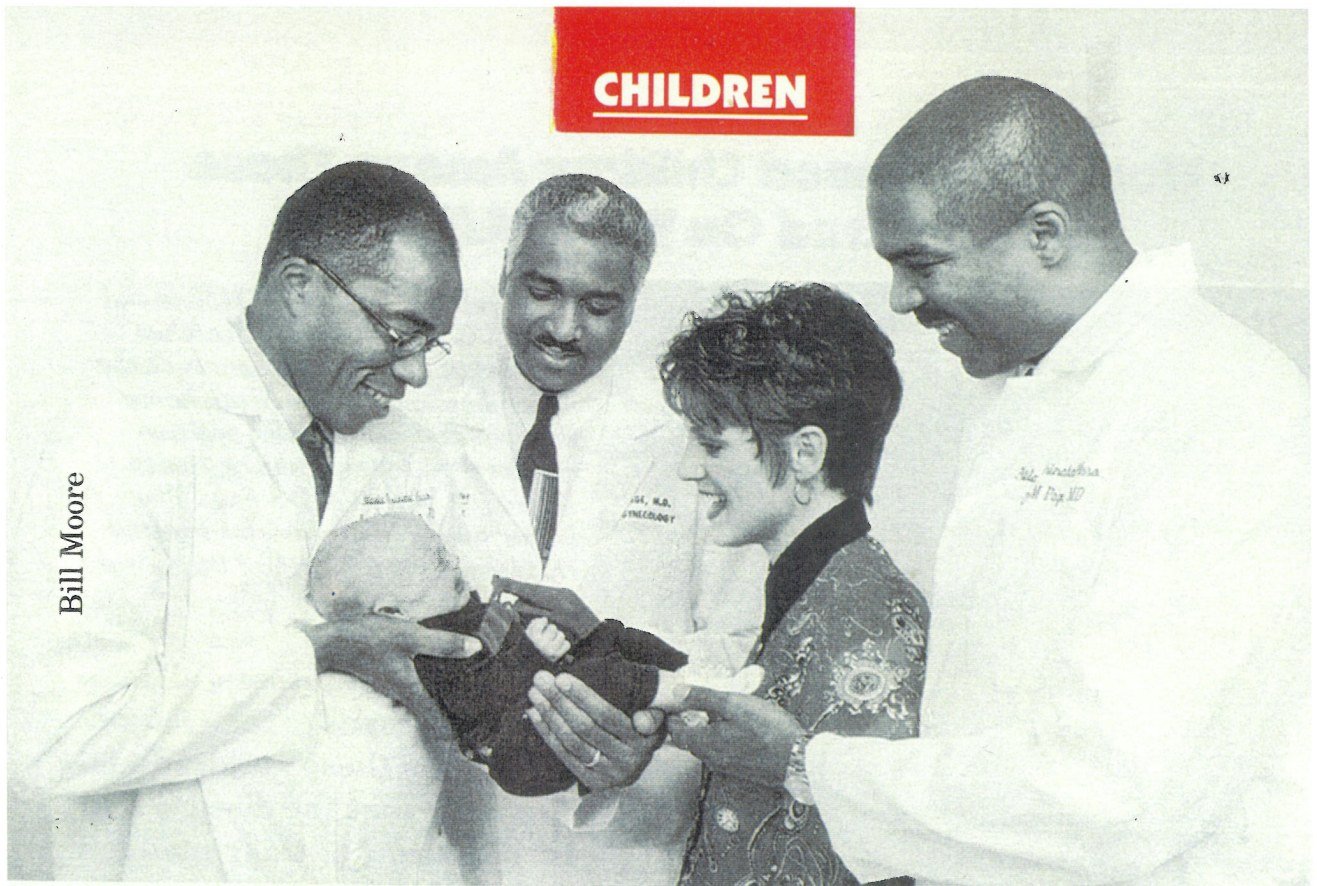

▲ **HISTORY-MAKING GEORGIA PERINATAL TRIO:** Dr. Brad Bootstaylor (l) and his colleagues, Dr. Kevin Gomez (c) and Dr. Dexter Page, admire cute little Palmer Pinholster as her mother, Dena Pinholster, observes. The three doctors, a perinatal team of partners with Atlanta Perinatal Associates in Atlanta, GA, saved the life of baby Palmer. When Dena was five months pregnant, doctors diagnosed a potentially lethal condition known as hydrops fetalis, an accumulation of fluid in the chest, abdomen and skin of the fetus. As forerunners in their field, Drs. Bootstaylor, Gomez and Page were able to save the baby by using an innovative in-utero surgical therapy where the fetus is reached by entering the mother's abdomen and proceeding through the uterus. The trio is the first Black perinatal group in the state of Georgia's history.
